The song "Singin' In the Rain" is a centerpiece of the musical film of the same name, Singin' in the Rain (1952). "Singin' in the Rain" was first performed by Doris Eaton Travis in the 1929 The Hollywood Music Box Revue. The song became a hit and was recorded by a number of artists, notably Cliff Edwards, who also performed the number with the Brox Sisters in the early MGM musical The Hollywood Revue of 1929. The song was performed on film by Jimmy Durante in Speak Easily (1932), by Judy Garland in Little Nellie Kelly (1940), and as background music at the beginning of MGM's The Divorcee (1930) starring Norma Shearer.
